THE STATS THAT MATTER

We live in a dynamic, economically volatile and currently damaged country.

- Over 40 000 formal businesses were looted, burnt and/or vandalised
- 150 000 informal traders' establishments were looted, burnt and/or vandalised
- 1400 ATMs were were looted, burnt and/or vandalised
- 100 malls were were looted, burnt and/or vandalised

Even before the recent riots, most South Africans have been struggling in the current already strained economy from COVID and general poverty.

What if we could flip the narrative and facilitate an inclusive, connected and empowered South Africa? We found that this worked in theory. However, there truly is nothing out there that supports a large scale catalyst to sustain change.

So, we decided to create it!



OBTAIN & ASSESS

- Obtain information: about affected areas (businesses, schools, communities) via databases, online research and community WhatsApp Groups
- Assess & Audit: site visit to gather all the information necessary to process for approval and planning
- Identify the relevant partners for approved sites

PLANNING & EXECUTION

- Set the dates for cleanup/rebuild efforts
- Create project plan, assign appropriate resources, (ensure CPF/Management inclusion in the process)
- Communicate to volunteers via SMS to direct the instructions for the project
- Promote the rebuild across channels

ACTION & REVIEW

- Execute according to project plan
- Manage waste removal through relevant partners
- Document the project for tracking
- Continued comms with relevant parties for post project matters
- Compile reporting and follow up notes

Implicated Businesses

The companies, businesses and informal traders who are severely affected by the riots and violence.

Locations

- KwaZulu Natal and Gauteng
- Townships, central business districts and micro businesses
- Malls and franchises

Stats

- Over 40 000 recorded businesses affected
- 161 malls, 200 shopping centers, 11 warehouses, 8 factories damaged
- Over 3000 stores looted
- Over 50 000 informal traders lost everything (our database shows over 80% were not insured at the time)


Needs

- Cleanups, rubble removals
- Infrastructural assistance, (professionals to assess buildings)
- Construction and rebuild manpower
- Trauma counselling and safety assurance

Notes

- Micro businesses need as little as R2000 to get back on their feet
- Medium businesses require infrastructure and larger financial support for at least two months
- Clean and rebuild first, sustain and heal second







Community Wellbeing

Trauma counselling for business owners, staff and security Community partnership in recovery and sustainable growth initiatives.

Locations

- KwaZulu Natal and Gautena
- Townships, central business districts and micro businesses
- Malls and franchises
- Hospitals and clinics

Notes

- As much as they need social workers and therapy, this element takes time and most are more concerned about their next meal than psychological help
- As the locals are the ones who are traumatized, observation and safe spaces for conversations are the first step
- It is key to include the community in rebuilding processes, as well as to sustain existing community programs
- Community business owner meetings have already commenced in GP townships
- Staff, security and witnesses are traumatized
- Lack of jobs and skills opportunities leave people restless and hopeless
- Business owners shocked and traumatized when some of their known locals came to destroy and loot; rebuilding trust and finding out 'the why' is essential

Intel

- In townships and culturally divided areas, tensions have been brewing between locals and business for some time
- 'Foreign' owned establishments more likely to have been burned to ashes
- Socio-economic circumstances have worsened frustrations
- Many CPF and community-led programs have stopped, due to lack of resources
- Primary schools' GR1 units mostly targeted due to resources for kids

Needs

- Conversations with business owners, communities and community leaders
- Support for local programs collaborated with community locals
- Social workers, trauma counsellors and holistic healing strategies
- Include local creatives to create beauty around the neighbourhoods
- Safety for everyone living in and traveling in and out of the affected areas daily

Damaged Schools

Although some of the schools were falling apart already, others were specifically targeted by looters.
School items, jungle gyms, zinc roofing and even toilets were taken.

Strategy

- Collaboration with local community leaders and relevant NGOs
- Getting communities to assist to build agri projects and work alongside RebuildSA to protect the schools
- Bimonthly trauma relief and social work checks where possible

Locations

Across Gauteng and KZN, however the documented totality of affected schools is yet to be determined.

Additional info

- Primary schools most targeted
- Food programs most affected
- Kids need social workers, therapy (some of their parents were core parts of the violence)

Needs

- Some require food relief for students (agri projects to make it sustainable)
- Some require windows, roofs, doors and toilets to be replaced
- Some require books, playground facilities
- Much social work and therapeutic support needed



Educate & Empower

Teaching business skills, marketing skills, skills that empower communities to sustain themselves.

Notes

- While this work is indeed meant to be the job of our government, waiting on them will take ages
- Connection and collaboration is key
- Packaged in a way that reunites communities and incentivizes them to take pride in their hometown

Businesses

- Helping businesses gain the skills to build and grow their businesses
- Teaching entrepreneurs digital skills (e.g. Digify Africa to assist youth entrepreneurs)
- Empowering local NGOs to ramp up efforts in their respective fields

Youth

- Helping community leaders to sustain their projects (eg Sports Against Crime)
- Empowering the youth to be key drivers in the transformation process
 Stipend work for soft skills

- **CPFs**
- Supporting CPFs to create and sustain their community works
- Some needs are as simple as airtime, others are as simple as soccer kits for the addiction recovering members of programs

- Donors of non perishable foods for families who have lost their income or who cannot access supplies




